Part A—Laws Matter

<u>FACTS</u> from Video	<u>SIGNIFICANCE</u> to Fish Wars
Treaties are discussed in Article VI of the U.S. Constitution.	
Indian nations have negotiated and signed treaties with the United states.	
States cannot make treaties with nations and cannot violate treaties made by the United States.	
The States of Washington and Oregon passed laws that limited Indians' rights to fish.	
U.S. courts agreed that Indians have a treaty right to fish where they had always fished before treaties.	
Washington State didn't agree with the U.S. courts' rulings.
